

Girls' Development Academy Scheduling

Academy Scheduling Philosophy: To provide a regular season and event schedule framework that will provide meaningful competition to enhance player development.

REGULAR SEASON:

- Scouting Opportunities Targeting a significant number of games overall to be scouted by TAs and/or USSF scouts; build out scouting network
- <u>Variety of Competition</u> Teams will play many different opponents in regular season (none more than 3 times per year) and will face opponents from different regions at events
- Playing Rhythm Girls' Academy teams will be scheduled for 20+ regular season games (varies by region) in order to provide a full season schedule with playing rhythm. Single fixtures will always be prioritized; Double fixture weekends will only be scheduled as required, based on travel distance.

EVENTS:

2017/18 Academy season will feature 3 showcase events: Winter Showcase (December), Spring Showcase (March / April) and Summer Showcase (June):

- Scouting Opportunities 100% of event games scouted by TAs and/or USSF scouts
- Meaningful Competition At Showcase events, teams are grouped; hand-picked matchups to provide the most competitive games
